CANCELLATION/REIMBURSEMENT POLICY:

- ◆ If the **Estuary Center cancels** a program, we will initiate a full credit, reimbursement upon request
- ◆ If **you need to cancel** registration for a program, you must call the Estuary Center
- ◆ If you cancel more than **two weeks** before the program, we will initiate a reimbursement minus a \$5 administrative fee
- ◆ No reimbursements for cancellations received less than **two weeks** before a program

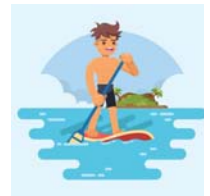

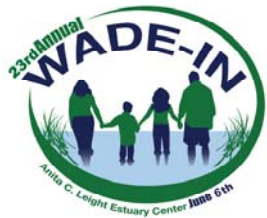
